### **New Jersey Employment Situation Summary**

#### **National Employment Data**

- Since President Biden took office, more than 6 million jobs have been created nationwide, an average of 565,000 created each month.
- In the month of December, the latest for which national data are available, 199,000 jobs were created, and the unemployment rate dropped to 3.9%, outperforming expectations and reaching a new pandemic-era low.
- The unemployment rate went down for adult men (3.6%), adult women (3.6%), white workers (3.2%), Hispanic workers (4.9%) and Asian workers (3.8%), and rose for Black workers (7.1%).

#### **State Employment Data**

- Since President Biden took office, 207,900 jobs have been created in New Jersey.
- In the month of December, the latest for which state-level data are available, 10,100 jobs were created in New Jersey.


