## Arkansas Employment Update

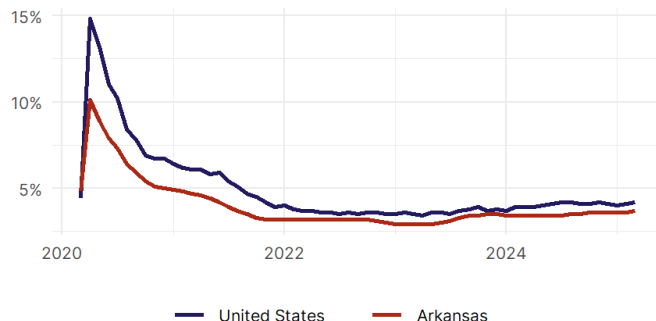
### United States Employment Snapshot

- In March, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 15, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 19.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.7 percent in **Nevada**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.2 percent.
- In March, **payroll jobs rose in 38 states and fell in 12.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Missouri**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Connecticut**.

### Arkansas Employment Snapshot

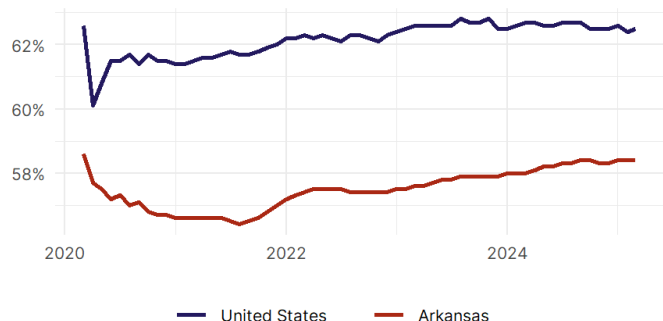
- In March, **Arkansas lost 200 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 3.7 percent.** In the prior month, Arkansas added 2,500 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Arkansas added 17,000 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.3 percentage points from 3.4 percent.**
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 228,000 in March, or 0.1 percent.** Arkansas **is tied for 12th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In March, **Arkansas's private sector lost 200 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 16,700 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Arkansas added 2,200 net private payroll jobs.
- In March, employment in Arkansas **fell by 242**, and over the past 12 months it rose by 15,686.
- **Arkansas's labor force participation rate remained steady at 58.4 percent** in March and **is tied for 43rd** in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.4 percentage points.
