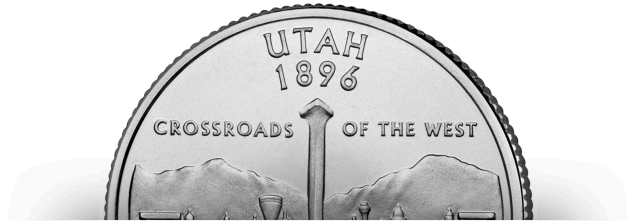

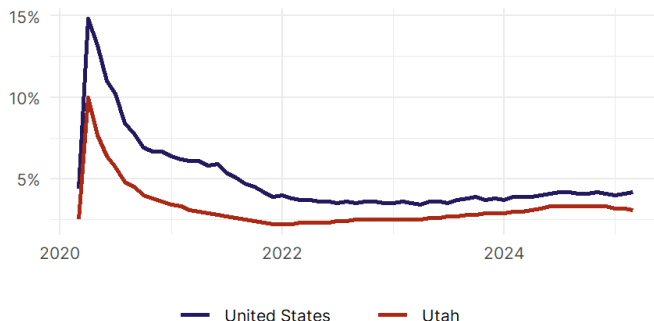
United States Employment Snapshot

- In March, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 15, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 19.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.7 percent in **Nevada**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.2 percent.
- In March, **payroll jobs rose in 38 states and fell in 12.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Missouri**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Connecticut**.

Utah Employment Snapshot

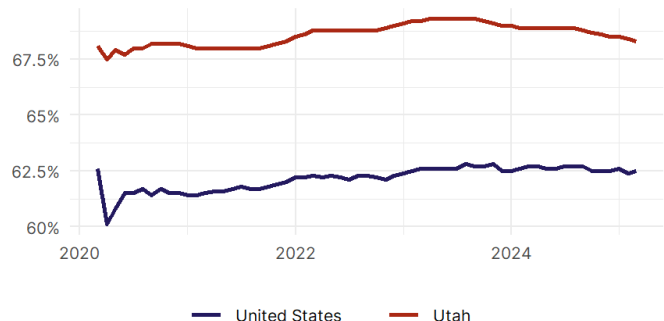
- In March, **Utah added 2,100 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate fell by 0.1 percentage point to 3.1 percent.** In the prior month, Utah added 800 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Utah added 33,000 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point from 3 percent.**
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 228,000 in March, or 0.1 percent.** Utah **ranks 3rd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In March, **Utah's private sector added 1,200 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 22,400 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Utah lost 300 net private payroll jobs.
- In March, employment in Utah **rose by 2,049**, and over the past 12 months it rose by 21,723.
- **Utah's labor force participation rate fell to 68.3 percent** in March from 68.4 percent and **ranks 5th** in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.6 percentage points.
