

## **United States** Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

## California Employment Snapshot

- In April, California added 17,700 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 5.3 percent. In the prior month, California lost 6,800 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, California added 68,000 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1
  percentage point from 5.2 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** California **ranks 43rd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, California's private sector added 13,200 net private payroll jobs, and over the past 12 months it added 9,100 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, California lost 13,900 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in California rose by 39,311, and over the past 12 months it rose by 118,670.
- California's labor force participation rate rose to 62.2 percent in April from 62.1 percent and ranks 32nd in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.1 percentage points.
