United States Employment Snapshot

- In August, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 12, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 6 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.3 percent.
- In August, **payroll jobs rose in 32 states and fell in 18.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Utah**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.7 percent in **District of Columbia**.

Colorado Employment Snapshot

- In August, Colorado added 3,000 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.3 percentage point to 4.2 percent. In the prior month, Colorado added 5,100 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Colorado added 18,300 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage points from 4.4 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 22,000 in August, or 0 percent.** Colorado **is tied for 33rd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In August, **Colorado's private sector added 3,300 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 8,800 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Colorado added 4,200 net private payroll jobs.
- In August, employment in Colorado rose by 4,219, and over the past 12 months it rose by 4,620.
- Colorado's labor force participation rate fell to 67.4 percent in August from 67.6 percent and ranks 8th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.7 percentage points.
