# **Delaware**Employment Update





## **United States** Employment Snapshot


- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

## **Delaware** Employment Snapshot


- In April, **Delaware added 1,200 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.2 percentage point to 3.9 percent**. In the prior month, Delaware added 400 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Delaware added 5,300 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.2** percentage points from 3.7 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Delaware **is tied for 20th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **Delaware's private sector added 800 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 3,600 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Delaware added 200 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Delaware rose by 32, and over the past 12 months it fell by 176.
- **Delaware's labor force participation rate remained steady at 58.9 percent** in April and **ranks 42nd** in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.9 percentage points.



### **Delaware Payroll Employment**



- Delaware added 1,200 net payroll jobs, or 0.2 percent, on a seasonally adjusted basis during April. In the prior
  month, Delaware added 400 jobs. Delaware nonfarm payroll employment has increased in 10 of the past 12
  months.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Delaware is tied for 20th in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- Delaware added 800 private sector jobs, or 0.2 percent. on a seasonally adjusted basis during April. In the prior
  month, Delaware added 200 jobs. Delaware private sector payroll employment has increased in 8 of the past 12
  months.
- Nationally, private sector payroll jobs **rose by 167,000 jobs in April, or 0.1 percent.** Delaware is tied for 22nd in the nation for percentage gain in private sector payroll employment over the past 12 months.




- The best performing sectors on a seasonally adjusted basis during April were **Government (400)** and **Trade**, **Transportation**, and **Utilities tied with Professional and Business Services (300)**.
- The poorest performing sectors during the month were **Manufacturing tied with Other Services (0)** and **Information (-100)**.
- The best performing sectors during the last 12 months were **Education and Health Services (3,300)** and **Government (1,700)**.
- The poorest performing sectors during the last 12 months were **Leisure and Hospitality (-300)** and **Financial Activities (-600)**.


#### **Delaware Labor Force**

The labor force participation rate is the percentage of the civilian noninstitutionalized population age 16 and older who are employed or actively looking for work.

- The labor force participation rate in Delaware remained unchanged at 58.9 percent in April.
- · Delaware ranks 42nd in the nation.
- The 10-year high for the labor force participation rate in Delaware was **63.2 percent** in June 2020, and the 10-year low was **58.9 percent** occurring in April 2025.
- The national labor force participation rate rose by 0.1 percentage points to 62.6 percent in April.
