

United States Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

Indiana Employment Snapshot

- In April, Indiana added 3,300 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage point to 3.9 percent. In the prior month, Indiana added 11,900 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Indiana added 16,800 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate fell by 0.1** percentage point from 4 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Indiana **is tied for 41st** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **Indiana's private sector added 4,800 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 12,100 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Indiana added 10,000 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Indiana rose by 6,593, and over the past 12 months it rose by 51,895.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate remained steady at 63.7 percent in April and ranks 22nd in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.4 percentage points.
