Maine Employment Update





United States Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

Maine Employment Snapshot

- In April, **Maine added 800 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.5 percent**. In the prior month, Maine remained unchanged with 0 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Maine added 4,000 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.7 percentage points from 2.8 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Maine **is tied for 38th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **Maine's private sector remained unchanged with 0 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 3,400 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Maine lost 200 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Maine fell by 995, and over the past 12 months it rose by 889.
- Maine's labor force participation rate fell to 60.1 percent in April from 60.2 percent and ranks 39th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.2 percentage points.
