

United States Employment Snapshot


- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

Nebraska Employment Snapshot


- In April, Nebraska added 2,600 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 3 percent. In the prior month, Nebraska added 1,800 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Nebraska added 6,100 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.3
 percentage points from 2.7 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent. Nebraska is tied for 38th in the nation for
 percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **Nebraska's private sector added 2,100 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 3,200 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Nebraska added 2,300 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Nebraska rose by 1,821, and over the past 12 months it rose by 12,456.
- Nebraska's labor force participation rate rose to 69.3 percent in April from 69.2 percent and ranks 3rd in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.4 percentage points.



Nebraska Payroll Employment



- Nebraska added 2,600 net payroll jobs, or 0.2 percent, on a seasonally adjusted basis during April. In the prior
 month, Nebraska added 1,800 jobs. Nebraska nonfarm payroll employment has increased in 7 of the past 12
 months.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Nebraska is tied for 38th in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- Nebraska added 2,100 private sector jobs, or 0.2 percent. on a seasonally adjusted basis during April. In the prior
 month, Nebraska added 2,300 jobs. Nebraska private sector payroll employment has increased in 7 of the past 12
 months.
- Nationally, private sector payroll jobs **rose by 167,000 jobs in April, or 0.1 percent**. Nebraska is tied for 39th in the nation for percentage gain in private sector payroll employment over the past 12 months.




- The best performing sectors on a seasonally adjusted basis during April were **Leisure and Hospitality (1,100)** and **Professional and Business Services (1,000)**.
- The poorest performing sectors during the month were Financial Activities (-200) and Construction (-400).
- The best performing sectors during the last 12 months were Education and Health Services (6,200) and Government (2,900).
- The poorest performing sectors during the last 12 months were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-1,900) and Professional and Business Services (-2,800).

Nebraska Labor Force

The labor force participation rate is the percentage of the civilian noninstitutionalized population age 16 and older who are employed or actively looking for work.

- The labor force participation rate in Nebraska rose to 69.3 percent in April from 69.2 percent in the prior month.
- · Nebraska ranks 3rd in the nation.
- The 10-year high for the labor force participation rate in Nebraska was 70.5 percent occurring in December 2019, and the 10-year low was 68.8 percent occurring in March 2024.
- The national labor force participation rate rose by 0.1 percentage points to 62.6 percent in April.
