


United States Employment Snapshot

- In August, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 12, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 6 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.3 percent.
- In August, **payroll jobs rose in 32 states and fell in 18.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Utah**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.7 percent in **District of Columbia**.

New Jersey Employment Snapshot

- In August, New Jersey added 4,900 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 5 percent. In the prior month, New Jersey added 6,400 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, New Jersey added 28,900 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.4 percentage points from 4.6 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 22,000 in August, or 0 percent**. New Jersey **is tied for 27th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In August, **New Jersey's private sector added 7,000 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 36,500 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, New Jersey added 10,300 net private payroll jobs.
- In August, employment in New Jersey fell by 7,062, and over the past 12 months it fell by 42,046.
- New Jersey's labor force participation rate fell to 63.5 percent in August from 63.6 percent and ranks 23rd in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.9 percentage points.
