## New York Employment Update

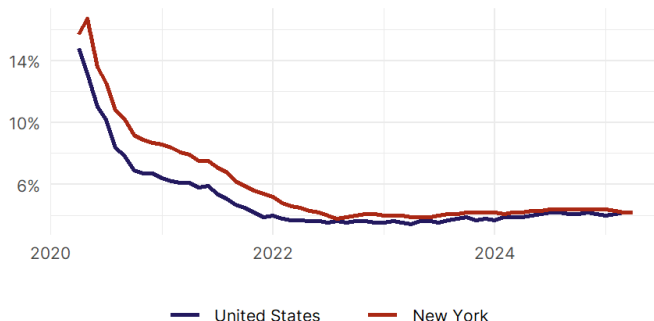
### United States Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26**.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11**. The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

### New York Employment Snapshot

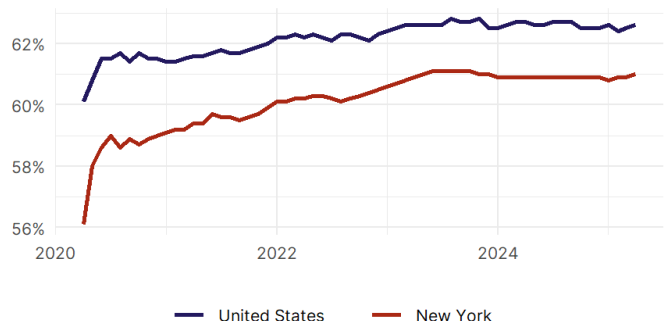
- In April, **New York added 15,400 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate remained unchanged at 4.2 percent**. In the prior month, New York lost 1,400 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **New York added 114,300 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate remained unchanged**.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent**. New York **is tied for 17th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **New York's private sector added 14,400 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 95,500 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, New York lost 1,500 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in New York **rose by 21,261**, and over the past 12 months it rose by 56,700.
- **New York's labor force participation rate rose to 61 percent** in April from 60.9 percent and **ranks 36th** in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.1 percentage points.
