## **United States** Employment Snapshot

- In August, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 12, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 6 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.3 percent.
- In August, **payroll jobs rose in 32 states and fell in 18.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Utah**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.7 percent in **District of Columbia**.

## **New York** Employment Snapshot

- In August, New York lost 16,100 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 4 percent. In the prior month, New York added 56,900 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, New York added 125,100 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.4 percentage points from 4.4 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 22,000 in August, or 0 percent.** New York **is tied for 13th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In August, **New York's private sector lost 13,300 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 77,300 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, New York added 12,400 net private payroll jobs.
- In August, employment in New York fell by 12,206, and over the past 12 months it rose by 47,311.
- New York's labor force participation rate fell to 60.8 percent in August from 60.9 percent and ranks 36th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.1 percentage points.
