## **Rhode Island**

**Employment Update**

## **United States** Employment Snapshot

- In August, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 12, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 6 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.3 percent.
- In August, **payroll jobs rose in 32 states and fell in 18.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Utah**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.7 percent in **District of Columbia**.

## **Rhode Island Employment Snapshot**

- In August, Rhode Island added 500 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage point to 4.6 percent. In the prior month, Rhode Island remained unchanged with 0 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Rhode Island added 1,700 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1
  percentage point from 4.5 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 22,000 in August, or 0 percent.** Rhode Island **is tied for 40th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In August, **Rhode Island's private sector added 300 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 2,300 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Rhode Island lost 600 net private payroll jobs.
- In August, employment in Rhode Island **rose by 2,055**, and over the past 12 months it fell by 3,355.
- Rhode Island's labor force participation rate rose to 63.7 percent in August from 63.6 percent and ranks 20th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.7 percentage points.
