

## **United States** Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

## **Tennessee** Employment Snapshot

- In April, Tennessee added 8,600 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.1 percentage point to 3.5 percent. In the prior month, Tennessee added 1,400 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Tennessee added 24,000 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.3** percentage points from 3.2 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Tennessee **is tied for 35th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **Tennessee's private sector added 8,300 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 15,000 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Tennessee added 500 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Tennessee rose by 12,741, and over the past 12 months it rose by 33,443.
- Tennessee's labor force participation rate rose to 59.7 percent in April from 59.6 percent and ranks 40th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.1 percentage points.
