


## **United States** Employment Snapshot

- In August, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 12, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 6 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.3 percent.
- In August, **payroll jobs rose in 32 states and fell in 18.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Utah**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.7 percent in **District of Columbia**.

## **Tennessee** Employment Snapshot

- In August, **Tennessee added 9,500 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.6 percent**. In the prior month, Tennessee added 3,500 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Tennessee added 34,400 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 22,000 in August, or 0 percent**. Tennessee **is tied for 18th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In August, **Tennessee's private sector added 8,900 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 24,100 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Tennessee added 3,300 net private payroll jobs.
- In August, employment in Tennessee rose by 9,030, and over the past 12 months it rose by 59,363.
- Tennessee's labor force participation rate rose to 60 percent in August from 59.9 percent and ranks 39th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.4 percentage points.
