United States Employment Snapshot

- In August, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 12, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 6 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.3 percent.
- In August, **payroll jobs rose in 32 states and fell in 18.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.5 percent in **Utah**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.7 percent in **District of Columbia**.

Texas Employment Snapshot

- In August, Texas added 17,600 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4.1 percent. In the prior month, Texas added 5,000 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Texas added 195,600 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.1 percentage point from 4.2 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 22,000 in August, or 0 percent.** Texas **is tied for 9th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In August, **Texas's private sector added 10,400 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 158,700 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Texas added 5,200 net private payroll jobs.
- In August, employment in Texas **fell by 127**, and over the past 12 months it rose by 180,457.
- Texas's labor force participation rate remained steady at 64.7 percent in August and is tied for 14th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.4 percentage points.
