

United States Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South** Dakota. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11. The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in Mississippi. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in Vermont.

Utah Employment Snapshot

- In April, Utah added 4,800 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.1 percent. In the prior month, Utah added 4,400 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Utah added 38,400 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent. Utah ranks 4th in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, Utah's private sector added 4,300 net private payroll jobs, and over the past 12 months it added 28,000 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Utah added 3,600 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Utah rose by 1,261, and over the past 12 months it rose by 20,727.
- Utah's labor force participation rate remained steady at 68.3 percent in April and ranks 5th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.6 percentage points.
