

United States Employment Snapshot

- In April, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 5, rose in 20, and remained unchanged in 26.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.8 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 1.8 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in April.
- In April, **payroll jobs rose in 40 states and fell in 11.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Mississippi**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.2 percent in **Vermont**.

Wisconsin Employment Snapshot

- In April, Wisconsin lost 1,500 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 3.3 percent. In the prior month, Wisconsin added 10,000 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Wisconsin added 15,100 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.4
 percentage points from 2.9 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 177,000 in April, or 0.1 percent.** Wisconsin **is tied for 41st** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In April, **Wisconsin's private sector lost 1,900 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 15,600 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Wisconsin added 11,400 net private payroll jobs.
- In April, employment in Wisconsin fell by 5,410, and over the past 12 months it fell by 9,872.
- Wisconsin's labor force participation rate fell to 65.5 percent in April from 65.6 percent and ranks 12th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.4 percentage points.
