



# April 2024

## **Summary**

Using the **April 2024** Consumer Price Index data release by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Joint Economic Committee (JEC) State Inflation Tracker estimates that the average household in **Delaware** is paying **\$1,163** more per month to purchase the same basket of goods and services as in January 2021.

Cumulatively, the average **Delaware** household has spent **\$26,770** more due to inflation since January 2021.





#### Breakdown

The Census Division where **Delaware** is located has seen cumulative inflation of **21.3 percent** since January 2021. This is **1.4 percentage points higher** than the national cumulative inflation since January 2021 of **19.9 percent**.


Compared to one year earlier, the average **Delaware** households needs to spend **\$210** more per month to maintain the same standard of living.

The JEC Inflation Tracker breaks down the increased cost to the average household in **Delaware** relative to January 2021 into four essential spending categories below:

#### **Household Food Expenses**


Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Delaware** is spending \$133 more on food per month. This is \$14 more each month than one year ago.

Cumulatively, the average household in **Delaware** has spent \$3,059 more on food due to inflation since January 2021.



## **Household Shelter Expenses**


Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Delaware** is spending **\$281** more on shelter per month. This is **\$74 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Delaware** has spent **\$5,408** more on shelter due to inflation since January 2021.



# **Household Energy Expenses**

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Delaware** is spending **\$139** more on energy per month. This is **\$7 more** each month than one year ago.

Cumulatively, the average household in **Delaware** has spent **\$4,181** more on energy due to inflation since January 2021.



# Household Transportation Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Delaware** is spending **\$314** more on transportation per month. This is **\$30 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Delaware** has spent **\$9,092** more on transportation due to inflation since January 2021.
