




Summary

Using the **December 2024** Consumer Price Index data release by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Joint Economic Committee (JEC) State Inflation Tracker estimates that the average household in **Minnesota** is paying \$1,242 more per month to purchase the same basket of goods and services as in January 2021.

Cumulatively, the average **Minnesota** household has spent **\$37,883** more due to inflation since January 2021.





Breakdown


The Census Division where **Minnesota** is located has seen cumulative inflation of **20.7 percent** since January 2021. This is **0.0 percentage points higher** than the national cumulative inflation since January 2021 of **20.7 percent**.

Compared to one year earlier, the average **Minnesota** households needs to spend **\$209** more per month to maintain the same standard of living.

The JEC Inflation Tracker breaks down the increased cost to the average household in **Minnesota** relative to January 2021 into four essential spending categories below:


Household Food Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Minnesota** is spending **\$166** more on food per month. This is **\$21 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Minnesota** has spent **\$5,032** more on food due to inflation since January 2021.




Household Shelter Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Minnesota** is spending **\$239** more on shelter per month. This is **\$62 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Minnesota** has spent **\$5,337** more on shelter due to inflation since January 2021.



Household Energy Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Minnesota** is spending **\$89** more on energy per month. This is **\$11 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Minnesota** has spent **\$5,450** more on energy due to inflation since January 2021.



Household Transportation Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Minnesota** is spending **\$328** more on transportation per month. This is **\$15 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Minnesota** has spent **\$13,747** more on transportation due to inflation since January 2021.
