




# **Summary**

Using the **December 2024** Consumer Price Index data release by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Joint Economic Committee (JEC) State Inflation Tracker estimates that the average household in **Oklahoma** is paying \$822 more per month to purchase the same basket of goods and services as in January 2021.

Cumulatively, the average **Oklahoma** household has spent **\$26,276** more due to inflation since January 2021.





#### Breakdown

The Census Division where **Oklahoma** is located has seen cumulative inflation of **20.5 percent** since January 2021. This is **0.2 percentage points lower** than the national cumulative inflation since January 2021 of **20.7 percent**.

Compared to one year earlier, the average **Oklahoma** households needs to spend **\$90** more per month to maintain the same standard of living.


The JEC Inflation Tracker breaks down the increased cost to the average household in **Oklahoma** relative to January 2021 into four essential spending categories below:

## **Household Food Expenses**

Compared to January 2021, the average


household in **Oklahoma** is spending \$120 more on food per month. This is \$12 more each month than one year ago.

Cumulatively, the average household in **Oklahoma** has spent \$3,490 more on food due to inflation since January 2021.



# **Household Shelter Expenses**


Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Oklahoma** is spending **\$168** more on shelter per month. This is **\$28 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Oklahoma** has spent **\$4,124** more on shelter due to inflation since January 2021.



## **Household Energy Expenses**

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Oklahoma** is spending **\$74** more on energy per month. This is **\$5 less** each month than one year ago.

Cumulatively, the average household in **Oklahoma** has spent **\$4,808** more on energy due to inflation since January 2021.



# Household Transportation Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Oklahoma** is spending **\$232** more on transportation per month. This is **\$4 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Oklahoma** has spent **\$9,894** more on transportation due to inflation since January 2021.
