

Summary

Using the **December 2024** <u>Consumer Price Index</u> data release by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Joint Economic Committee (JEC) <u>State Inflation Tracker</u> estimates that the average household in **Texas** is paying **\$1,036** more per month to purchase the same basket of goods and services as in January 2021.

Cumulatively, the average **Texas** household has spent **\$33,094** more due to inflation since January 2021.



Breakdown


The Census Division where **Texas** is located has seen cumulative inflation of **20.5 percent** since January 2021. This is **0.2 percentage points lower** than the national cumulative inflation since January 2021 of **20.7 percent**.

Compared to one year earlier, the average **Texas** households needs to spend **\$113** more per month to maintain the same standard of living.

The JEC Inflation Tracker breaks down the increased cost to the average household in **Texas** relative to January 2021 into four essential spending categories below:

Household Food Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Texas** is spending **\$151** more on food per month. This is **\$16 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Texas** has spent **\$4,395** more on food due to inflation since January 2021.



Household Shelter Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Texas** is spending **\$211** more on shelter per month. This is **\$36 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Texas** has spent **\$5,194** more on shelter due to inflation since January 2021.

Household Energy Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Texas** is spending **\$94** more on energy per month. This is **\$7 less** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Texas** has spent **\$6,056** more on energy due to inflation since January 2021.

Household Transportation Expenses

Compared to January 2021, the average household in **Texas** is spending **\$293** more on transportation per month. This is **\$5 more** each month than one year ago. Cumulatively, the average household in **Texas** has spent **\$12,461** more on transportation due to inflation since January 2021.
